

# UNLV GREENSPUN HALL FACT SHEET

**Project Cost:** \$93.7 million. The Greenspun Family Foundation contributed \$37 million for the project — the largest single donation in UNLV history and one of the largest in state history.

The Greenspun College of Urban Affairs was created in 1996 to reflect UNLV's commitment to the community it serves and to the goal of becoming a major metropolitan research university. Through research, teaching, and the development of innovative collaborations between students, faculty, and the community, the college seeks to prepare community leaders and provide solutions to some of our most pressing societal problems.

With the completion of Greenspun Hall, six of the seven academic units that comprise the Greenspun College of Urban Affairs will for the first time be housed in one central location. Greenspun Hall was designed, in part, to help foster closer collaboration among department faculty and to encourage interdisciplinary efforts to address the critical issues affecting the quality of life in our state, the region, and the world.

- Media Facility (1<sup>st</sup> floor – opening in fall 2009)
- Student Advising Center for the Greenspun College of Urban Affairs (2<sup>nd</sup> floor)
- Hank Greenspun School of Journalism and Media Studies (2<sup>nd</sup> Floor)
- Environmental Studies (3<sup>rd</sup> Floor)
- School of Social Work (3<sup>rd</sup> Floor)
- Communication Studies (4<sup>th</sup> Floor)
- Public Administration (4<sup>th</sup> Floor)
- Criminal Justice (5<sup>th</sup> Floor)
- Office of the Dean of the College of Urban Affairs (5<sup>th</sup> Floor)
